Building Update

It's wonderful to watch the progress of the buildings being developed, both at the ELC and Primary School (St John's) campus and at the Middle and Senior School (Concordia) campus.

At St John's Campus, the ELC students are enjoying Stage 1 of their new facility while their two additional classes are being finalised along with their new sandpit, play space and a Junior Primary sandpit.

The three-storey building is also nearing completion. The builders are completing the interior, the external windows and doors are being installed and the external facade is being attached. This stage, along with associated landscaping, will be available for occupancy in early November.

Upon completion of this building, work will then commence on converting the existing Resource Centre (the Red Shed) into a multi-purpose hall.

At the Middle and Senior School, building works on the new College gymnasium have been slightly delayed due to inclement weather. Blockwork at the northern end has now commenced along with the lift shaft. Structural steel will also be completed in the next month. This project is now due for completion in Term 2, 2023.

In other exciting developments, the College will be refurbishing the Year 9 classes and breakout space, the Resource Centre in the Hamann Wing and the Year 12 central area in the Atrium.

These initiatives are supported by State Government Grant funding and will be undertaken in the Christmas holidays.

As a result of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse in 2017, [10 National Principles](#) were developed by the Australian Human Rights Commission. The Royal Commission has recommended that all organisations that have contact with children must comply with the principles which replace the former SA Principles of Child Safety Good Practice.

Lutheran Education SA, NT, and WA (LESNW), in conjunction with CompliSpace, have developed a compliant Child Safe Policy, Code of Conducts and procedures. These were all approved by the College Board at the Board meeting held on Wednesday 24 August 2022.

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Immunisation Information for Parents/Legal Guardians of Year 8 Students

Eastern Health Authority (EHA) will be returning to Concordia College on **Friday 23 September 2022** for the below vaccination.

- **2nd dose of the human papillomavirus vaccine (HPV), Gardasil®9**

A reminder to parents: Students in Year 8 are offered two free vaccines six months apart to be fully vaccinated against Human Papillomavirus. It is important that your child is present at school on the day when EHA will be providing second doses.

Please notify EHA if:

- Your child has already received the 2nd dose with another provider
- You wish to withdraw your consent
- Your child's medical condition has changed

Tips for the day of immunisation:

- Encourage your child to have a good breakfast and recess on the morning of immunisations
- Wear sports uniforms to aid easy access to the upper arm and avoid unnecessarily exposing yourself if clothing needs to be removed/undone
- Encourage your child to keep their arms moving and drink plenty of water throughout the day.

If you did not receive an immunisation consent form from your child at the beginning of the school year, please ask SSO, or if unavailable contact EHA on 8132 3600.

If you have any further questions about the program, please directly contact **Eastern Health Authority on 8132 3600 or via e-mail at eha@eha.sa.gov.au**

Remember: it is your responsibility to notify EHA on 8132 3600 of any changes or information, particularly in relation to your child's medical condition, on the day of immunisation or prior. A signed and dated note in your child's diary from a parent or guardian presented on the day is acceptable.

School Immunisation Program records may be required for future employment or travel.
