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## From the Director of Learning and Wellbeing

In 2025, Concordia College will be activating our 'Learning Well' framework. This framework positions our current Instructional Model alongside our new Wellbeing Model to support us in connecting, empowering and challenging our learners.

The new Wellbeing Model describes wellbeing as “the equilibrium between the challenges an individual is facing, and the resources they have to face them”. This can be visualised as a ‘see-saw’, with challenges on one side and resources on the other. When we encounter a challenge in our life (whether it be academic, physical, psychological, social or spiritual), our

system of resources and challenges come into a state of imbalance, and we are forced to adapt our resources (whether they be academic, physical, psychological, social or spiritual) to meet the challenge. Our wellbeing 'dips' if we are unable to correct the balance, which occurs when we do not have sufficient resources to meet a challenge or when we have insufficient challenge to meet our resources.

This definition and model, adapted from Dodge et al. (2012), has been chosen because it is:

- Simple – it can be easily understood and communicated
- Universal – it applies to all individuals, regardless of age, gender or race
- Agentic – it empowers individuals to take responsibility for their own wellbeing and be active in responding to imbalances
- Useful – it can be used proactively and reactively
- Individualised – it does not present 'one-size-fits-all' solutions or approaches
- Inclusive of (and normalises) challenge – it does not discourage challenge or promote avoidance of challenge; it is not healthy to always sit in our comfort zone or avoid discomfort.

The 'Learning Well' framework is designed to help Concordia be a community where individuals are encouraged to be agents of their own learning and wellbeing, rather than leaving it up to a 'default' state or assuming it is the responsibility of another party.

The 'Learning Well' framework is shown below. It is built for use in our classrooms and acknowledges the importance that both learning and wellbeing play in producing extraordinary outcomes – during school, and after it.

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## Upward Psychology Partnership

As part of the activation of the Wellbeing Model in our new 'Learning Well' framework, I am excited to share the College's partnership with **Upward Psychology** in 2025.

Dr David Scholz, Director and Principal Psychologist of Upward Psychology, will be operating his private practice on-site, and keeping appointments available specifically for the Concordia College community. This will mean that families who are wanting to engage with an external private psychologist will be able to do so, with very minimal wait times.

David is a registered psychologist and a registered teacher, who has worked in schools as a teacher and senior leader for over two decades. After seeing the frustrations many schools and families experience trying to access support, David is now committing his energy and expertise entirely to partnering with schools to provide timely and highly-contextual support to young people by working in direct partnership with their school.

David is able to provide Educational and Psychological Assessments and evidence-based psychological interventions for anxiety, depression, perfectionism, trauma, stress and performance, along with other challenges faced by children, adolescents and their families.

The advantages that this partnership provides for the Concordia community include:

- minimal waiting time for an appointment
- appointments can occur during the school day, meaning assessments and interventions can occur without large disruptions due to pick up and travel time, etc.
- the Psychologist works directly with teachers and school leaders as appropriate, resulting in a greater efficacy of the external support.

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## **Remembering Two Cherished Members of Our Concordia Community**

With deep gratitude and respect, we acknowledge the passing of two Old Concordians whose lives were marked by service, generosity, and faith.

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Rev Dr Elmore Leske (Class of 1940)

We honour the extraordinary life of service of Old Concordian and past Principal Rev Dr Elmore Leske, who passed away on 25 January 2025.

Elmore's connection with Concordia began in 1940 when he joined as an 11-year-old boarder. He later returned as a teacher and at just 31 years old, was appointed Headmaster. During his eight years of leadership, he introduced significant advancements, including curriculum updates, improved facilities and expanded transport services, all while fostering enrolment growth. His vision and dedication left an enduring legacy of excellence and faith at the College.

Elmore's commitment to the College was also evident through his authorship of our centenary history publication, a book titled 'Concordia 100 Years: Murtoa - Adelaide', which remains an invaluable resource.

Tim Noske (Class of 1985)

With great sadness, we share the passing of Old Concordian Tim Noske, who tragically lost his life on 14 January 2025 at just 52 years of age.



Tim and his family share a long and valued history with Concordia. He successfully operated the family-run Max Noske & Sons Butchery and was known not only for his contributions to the local community but also for his remarkable generosity to the College. Tim was always willing to lend a hand, generously donating meats for countless College events over the years.

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## Year 7 and 10 School Immunisation Program 2025

Together with SA Health, the School Immunisation Program will be offered at Concordia College by Eastern Health Authority (EHA) in 2025.

### Immunisation for Parents/Legal Guardians of Year 7 and 10 Students

All Year 7 students will be offered:

- one dose of the human papillomavirus vaccine, Gardasil®9
- one dose of the diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough vaccine, Boostrix®

All Year 10 students will be offered:

- two doses of the meningococcal B vaccine, Bexsero® at two separate visits (8 weeks apart)
- one dose of the meningococcal ACWY vaccine, Nimenrix®

The **Year 7** immunisations will occur on **Tuesday 25 March**.

The **Year 10** Immunisations will occur on **Friday 30 May** and **Tuesday 23 September**.

Immunisation consent packs have been sent home with all Year 7 and 10 students. It is important that you read the information contained in the packs before you give consent for your child to be vaccinated at school.

- 1 dose of the diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough vaccine, Boostrix®

The Eastern Health Authority (EHA) will be visiting Concordia College on Tuesday 25 March to complete the Human Papillomavirus (HPV), Gardasil®9, diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough vaccine and Boostrix® immunisations for Year 7 students where consent has been provided.

If you did not receive an immunisation consent form from your child, please ask at the school office (SSO) for one. If unavailable, contact EHA on 8132 3600.

**If any information you gave on the original consent form has changed, please inform the Authority's immunisation staff before the date of vaccination on 8132 3600.**

Please notify us if:

- Your child has already completed the HPV, diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, Gardasil®9 vaccine and/or Boostrix® immunisation program with another provider.
- You wish to withdraw your consent.
- Your child's medical condition has changed.

**Remember: It is your responsibility to advise the vaccinator on the day of immunisation of any change in the information on the consent form, in particular, your child's medical condition. A signed and dated note presented to the vaccinator on the day of immunisation from a parent or guardian in your child's diary is acceptable.**
