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## From the Early Learning Centre Directors

Every day we play in our Early Learning Centres and this how the majority of our learning occurs. Play develops children's skills in a natural way that is engaging as they follow their interests while they explore, experiment and make sense of their world.

Problem solving, using memory and critical thinking are all things that happen regularly in play, and these are important aspects of cognitive development. Imagination and creativity are used often in socio-dramatic play and arts and crafts, and these skills are needed in life for being innovative and adaptable.

Social and emotional development is an area that we really focus on in our ELCs. Through play children are taking turns, sharing, interacting and cooperating with others, negotiating and developing leadership skills. They are also learning how to manage their emotions and developing empathy for others.

Oral language development is another area that is really important for children in the ELC as this is the starting point for early literacy skills. Communication is used throughout play as children share their thoughts and ideas and express themselves. We listen to a lot of stories each day in the ELC to extend our general knowledge and language skills. Literacy and numeracy skills are developed through activities, games, songs, discussions and books.

Each day the children in the ELC are involved in activities that extend their physical development. Fine motor skills are developed when they play with and manipulate small items, strengthening the muscles in their hands and improving coordination. Gross motor activities are planned and encouraged through free play for the children, to strengthen the big muscles

in their bodies. This happens as they run, climb, balance, throw, jump, etc.

Free play occurs when the children choose what they want to do from a range of activities that are provided. Because they are choosing what and how to do the experience, it is fun and the learning that they do is engaging, memorable and impactful.

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## **Year 11 and Year 4 ALWS Partnership**

During Week 10 of Term 1, our Year 4 students engaged in an enlightening experience designed to teach them about the Australian Lutheran World Service (ALWS), guided by our Year 11 ALWS Student Ambassadors (Laura, Airlie, Claire and Genevieve). This session aimed to deepen their understanding of the critical work ALWS undertakes, particularly in supporting communities facing significant challenges in accessing necessities such as clean water and adequate shelter. The ambassadors shared compelling stories of individuals who must journey great distances daily to secure water, often living in makeshift shelters that offer minimal protection from the elements, painting a vivid picture of the hardships endured in developing countries.

The Year 4 students participated in a shelter-building activity, using limited resources to construct homes that mirrored the types of dwellings common in these communities. This hands-on exercise provided a glimpse into the daily realities of those living in inadequate housing, sparking thoughtful discussions about the importance of secure shelter. Following this, the students engaged in a water relay, simulating the long distances many people must travel to obtain clean water. This activity highlighted the physical demands and time constraints these journeys impose, fostering a deeper appreciation for the ease with which we access water in our daily lives. The students also spent time reflecting on the blessings they often take for granted, cultivating a sense of gratitude for the privileges they enjoy. They decorated small paper hands which were displayed on the oval fence.

ALWS hosts a "Walk My Way" event each year, and we warmly invite you to join us in supporting their vital work in future years. This event offers an opportunity to walk in solidarity with those who face daily challenges in accessing basic necessities, raising funds to support

ALWS projects that provide clean water, shelter and education to communities in need. ## Immunisation Information for Parents / Appointed Legal Guardians of Year 10 Students

The SA 2025 School Immunisation Program will be delivered by **Eastern Health Authority on Friday 30 May 2025** (first visit).

All Year 10 students will be offered:

- 2 doses of the meningococcal B vaccine at 2 separate visits (8 Weeks apart)
- 1 dose of the meningococcal ACWY vaccine

Immunisation Consent packs have been provided to all Year 10 students at the commencement of the school year, including information about the vaccines on offer. If you did not receive an Immunisation Consent pack, please contact the school office direct so this pack can be provided to you.

We would encourage all parents/appointed legal guardians to read the information supplied in the packs before providing consent for your child to be vaccinated at school. Additional, further information and videos are available [online \(click to view\)](#) if required.

**If you have provided consent to participate in the immunisation program and information has changed, in particular in relation to your child's medical condition or if you wish to withdraw consent, please directly notify your school immunisation provider (Eastern Health Authority) as soon as possible prior to the date of immunisation.**

Tips for the day of immunisation:

- encourage your child eat prior to the immunisations and drink plenty of water throughout the day; and
- wear sports uniform to allow for easy access to the upper arm.
