Spotlight on an Old Concordian

Ken Semmler OAM



Concordia was honored to have Ken Semmler OAM attend and read the lesson at the 11/11/2022 Remembrance Day Service in front of staff and students.Born in Tanunda in 1945, Ken Semmler attended St Jacobi Lutheran Primary School and Nuriootpa High School before coming to Concordia College in 1962.

Ken spent 10 years as a fighter pilot in the Royal Australian Air Force, with the rank of Flight Lieutenant flying Sabres and Mirages.

For his work in Lutheran Education and the community, in 2014 Ken Semmler was recognised and awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM). We asked Ken to sit down and answer some questions for us...

Tell us about your life since Concordia...

10 years as a fighter pilot in the RAAF, aide-de-camp to Gov General the late Sir Paul Hasluck, then farming in the Barossa. Other involvements include: grape-growers assn., RSL and Chair of Lutheran Schools Association in its early days, including chairing a team to establish a second secondary school in Barossa, then chair of Faith Lutheran School. Director of LCA Giving to Grow Appeal. Also assisted many oversees and immigrant aid groups, including a refugee/new arrivals sewing group for about 19 yrs, which also involved taking folk shopping, assisting with Centrelink, housing, household goods, medical, school, mending pushbikes, cars and other essential activities.

Being in the first (No 75) Mirage squadron, deploying to Malaysia and the privilege of serving in Vietnam with the USAF.

Alex Bruhn, Class of 2011





We are so proud of Alex, who is the recipient of two Young Citizen of the Year awards for her contributions to the community in recent years. She gave life to an Adelaide chapter of Conscious Cities Festival which was a vessel for exploration of the deep first nations wisdom that exists on Kaurna land, starting dialogue on the legacy being left for future generations and empowering young people to flex their civic duty. Alex was also commended for her work on the Foundations for Tomorrow -Awareness to Action Report. Over ten thousand young Australians were consulted about issues particularly significant to their generation, such as the long-term impact of climate change and housing affordability.

Alex is currently serving a 12-month mandate as the Curator of Global Shapers Adelaide, an initiative of the World Economic Forum. She recently represented the state in Geneva, Switzerland at the WEF headquarters. Alex features in the Department for Premier and Cabinet's recent New State of Mind campaign, representing leadership in South Australia's innovation in education space. She is about to embark on a Master's Degree with Torrens University to further enhance her capabilities in innovation and change in education.

Alex works at Youth Inc., a new school designed for people 17-24 and ushers in and incubates new innovative educational programs for Adelaide's youth. Alex's most prominent pieces of work within the school include Ideas to Un-F*ck the World - an ideas incubator for young people to connect with game-changers, address social problems and weaponize their own stories and Metaverse Adventures - a means to unravel the ethics, interactions and potential for the metaverse as well as the evolution of the technologies, programming and other opportunities stemming from this concept. Alex's programs aim to equip youth with skills for the fourth industrial revolution.
