Spotlight on an Old Concordian

Lifetime Connections -Dennis Wegener (Class of 1958)

Our Alumni Manager, Sue Kleinig, met up with Dennis and his wife Lyn at the opening of the College's Fortiter Gymnasium late in 2023. After taking the time to look at the Concordia Honour Board in The Suaviter, where Dennis is listed for his service in the Vietnam war, Sue was very interested to find out more about his story.

Dennis and Lyn have three daughters who attended Concordia College: Mrs Tammy Hayward (1992), Mrs Kerrie Rivett (1994), and Mrs Jodie Childs (1996), wife of Jake Childs (1994), who also went to Concordia. Lachlan and Jemma Hayward are grandchildren of Dennis and current Concordia students, making them third generation Old Concordians! Dennis shared an article from the Australian Lutheran Youth magazine from April 1966, which gave a great account of his army career.

We have summarised it here for you:

"When Dennis received the call-up for National Service, he felt it his duty to go along ... Dennis also says he was very patriotic and wanted to see the world. Dennis had been working on his father's farm in country South Australia for 4 years after finishing at Concordia, and on July 1st, 1965 reported to Keswick Barracks where he was given a oneway plane ticket to Puckapunyal. After shivering through basic training there, he was posted to 2RAR in Brisbane for Infantry Corps training. ... After returning home for Christmas, Dennis was transferred to 5RAR near Sydney, and then did jungle training in Qld... Then, after participating in a farewell march through the streets of Sydney, he left for Vietnam."

Dennis remembers clearly the death of Errol Noack, also an Old Concordian, who was killed within a few hours of being flown by chopper inland from the temporary base at Vung Tau. He was the first National Serviceman killed In Vietnam.

"Serving as an infantryman, Dennis was involved in patrolling (No. 2 on machine gun) in bushland and jungle, conducting all-night ambushes, and was always on the alert for landmines. Other hazards were the rain and sleeping on a sheet of plastic, often in wet clothes, as well as the biggest scorpions, spiders and centipedes he has ever seen! On April 30th, 1967, after serving for one year, Dennis marched through Sydney again, and flew home to a warm welcome. Later, when the war became unpopular, soldiers were not welcomed home in the same way."

In 1998 Dennis and Lyn travelled to Vietnam and found it a beautiful country with friendly people. Due to huge areas sprayed with agent orange, there are many eucalyptus trees which were planted where there where once native trees, a very different landscape to the one he witnessed in 1967!

Where has life taken you since Concordia College?

When I graduated from Concordia, I had a pretty good sense that I wanted to be a journalist, but I felt a bit daunted by committing to another long chunk of study if I wasn't 100% sure. So, I decided to take a gap year - which turned into two gap years - to work, travel, volunteer and test my ambition for journalism. After some amazing experiences in Brazil, the US, London and Europe, and Indonesia (and a lot of shifts in the Myer intimate apparel department!) I began the Bachelor of Journalism at UniSA. Getting this qualification gave me access to all kinds of job opportunities and I started my career at a regional newspaper in Mount Gambier, The Border Watch. From there I took all kinds of other opportunities that came up - reporting for radio and TV from Darwin and across the NT, then in the Melbourne ABC newsroom. Along the way I focused more and more on narrative journalism and podcasting. In 2016 my partner and I married and moved to New York for a new adventure, where I found a role as a producer in the buzzing world of podcasts, at a studio called Stitcher. When the pandemic hit in 2020, we returned home and started a family. Tom (who is also from Adelaide) and I now have a toddler and welcomed our second child in the spring of 2023. I've returned to the ABC in Melbourne as an Executive Producer for podcasts and I also teach broadcast journalism at RMIT University on the side. I love life in Melbourne but I miss Adelaide and we take trips back as often as possible. Every time I drive up Duthy Street I peek down towards Concordia and wonder what life is like there now.

What are your fondest/funniest memories of Concordia?

I have so many fond memories of my years at Concordia. Drama class with Ms Chester was always a highlight, and Mr Modra sparked my love of broadcast journalism by teaching us how to operate TV studios and present programs on Channel 31. I loved walking home every day with my friend Davie and stopping at the bakery for a honey bun, and quickly trying to tuck in my shirt if we ever saw a teacher pass us on our way home. We all pretended we were bored during Chapel every morning, but actually I think we loved the routine of starting the day in such a beautiful space and hearing Pastor Rob's calm voice. In hindsight I'm amazed at the lengths our teachers went to for us - our English Studies teacher Mrs Held invited us all to her house for individual coaching before Year 12 exams, using her spare time and feeding us when we were there too! Most of all, I remember the school as being a supportive place which embodied its motto, Firm in Principle, Gentle in Manner - a principle I try to apply as a parent now in my everyday interactions with my son.

What motivates you?

Relationships are central to all my choices - where I live, how much I work, who I work with and the impact of my work. I love the kind of journalism and storytelling that humanises every kind of life experience and portrays the complexity of life, far beyond news headlines. I love to create productions where teams of kind, smart people come together and creativity sparks through collaboration, and we can tell stories that might expand a listener's worldview or challenge a prejudice.

What advice would you give to students?

Enjoy high school! It is such a privilege to go to a good school and have access to great opportunities and people who are there to support you and want to see you flourish. So, embrace that and seek guidance and support so that you can make the most of your time at Concordia... and remember, the relationships you make at high school will last a lifetime, so treat them that way. My closest friends today are still the group of friends I made at Concordia, and I'm honoured to be able to remain connected to this part of my life even through this newsletter Q&A!
